VENTURERS HELP OUT - PRISCILLA EBY



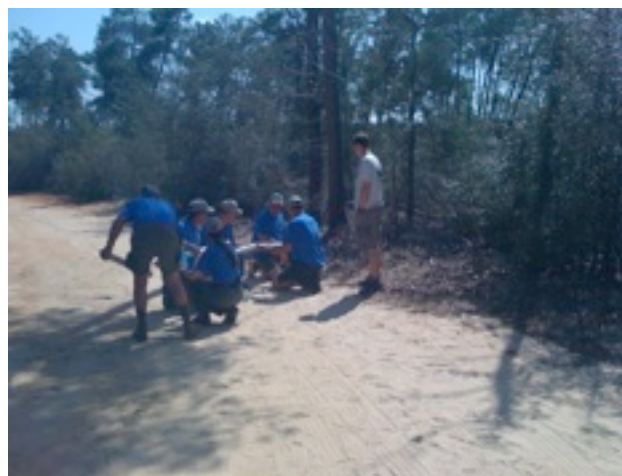
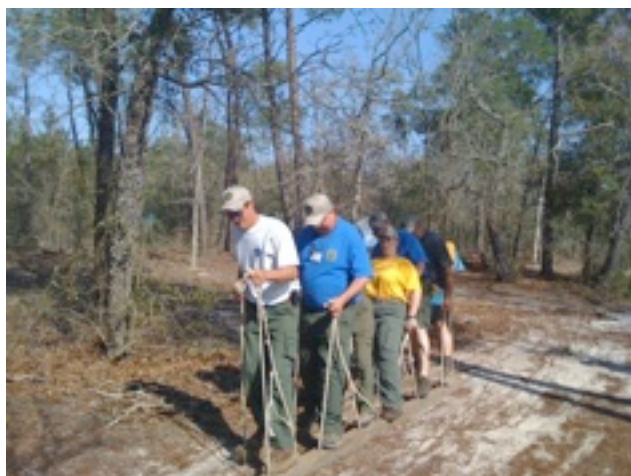

Two days before the 100th anniversary of the Boy Scouts of America, 20 youth and adult members of Venture Crew 6, South Texas Council, from Corpus Christi, TX descended upon Austin, Texas for the 61st Annual Report to State. We were just like any other contingent that day, honored to represent our Council and to be able to become a part of this tradition. We paraded twelve blocks down Congress Avenue to the State Capitol, met Governor Rick Perry, an Eagle Scout, before we all assembled in the House Chambers to give the state of the Council.

There was just one thing that made us stand out from all of the rest of the scouts and scouters there. Instead of wearing the traditional Venturing Uniform, we instead opted for wearing the uniform we are known for... The uniform of the US Cavalry from the post Civil War era. Since its charter as Post 6 in 1989, we have



been a living history unit that is primarily known in our area for portraying Cavalrymen and women in the 1870s and 1880s, setting up Cavalry camps and teaching others how the soldiers lived in those frontier days.

The highlight of the day was to be able to take a contingent picture with Governor Perry. He asked us about our uniforms and shared some of his experiences when he was a scout. Almost everyone in Austin was impressed by our uniforms and of our knowledge of its history. We even had everyday tourists stop us to have their chance at getting a picture taken with us. We were glad to be able to take part in this time honored tradition and hope to one day do it again.

The 3rd annual Venture Extreme Weekend took place at Spring Lake on the Ozark-St. Francis National Forests near Dardanelle, Arkansas. 12 teams of 4 people from Venture Crews in the Westark Area Council were challenged to a full day of outdoor activities.

Each team spent Friday evening plotting their UTM coordinates on USGS maps to prepare for Saturday's challenging

cross-country course. Each team could choose to either hike a 5 mile course with 12 check points or the course for those that chose to ride bikes included 11 miles biking and 3 miles hiking that had 19 checkpoints. All teams participated in a ½ mile canoe course with 2 additional check points on Spring Lake. Each check point had a password that had to be written down on the teams score sheet. Only a map and compass could be used; no GPS, cell phones or e-compasses were allowed.

The course was extremely challenging due to the hilly terrain and wet creek crossing but the

weather was perfect. Along the way, the teams had the opportunity to rappel down a 40 foot cliff after they had hiked around to the top!

Along the way for extra points, each team picked up trash to bring back to the main campground where they each completed a conservation/clean up of the campsites and program areas.

At 6pm a small thunderstorm moved through but only dropped a little rain and some wind. The day ended with an awards campfire recognizing the days accomplishments by all.

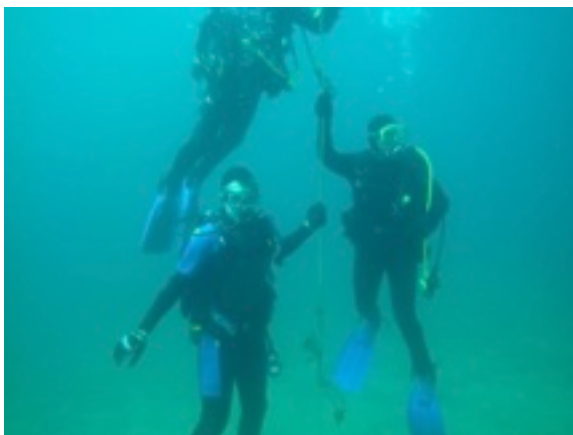
